

## When To Come To Hospital





#### Labour "4-1-1"

- Contractions are
  - STRONG
  - Every 4 minutes
  - Each last 1 minute
  - □ ... for 1 hour





## "GBS" Status

- □ Group B Streptococcus
- A very common bacteria
  - If present during vaginal birth → risk to baby
- If POSITIVE = antibiotics should be started at the beginning of labour




#### Water Breaks










Mount Sinai Labour & Delivery – TRIAGE UNIT

## Pain Management

#### At home...

- Walking
- Positions
- Shower
- Warm bath (if waters intact)
- Massage
- □ lce
- Breathing







### In hospital...

□ Early labour - morphine □ During delivery - nitrous


to take the edge off oxide – "laughing gas"





## In hospital...

- Epidural anesthesia
  - Takes 15-30 min. for Anesthesiologist to arrive
  - Another 15 min. to work 85-90% work 1<sup>st</sup> time
  - Only "too late" for epidural if delivery within minutes or can't hold this position




### **Epidural Anesthesia**

- 85% of women in Ontario deliver with an epidural
  - MAJOR risks = RARE
    - 1/150,000 risk of infection, paralysis, blood clot, disability or death
  - MINOR risks = COMMON
    - Low blood pressure
    - Baby heart rate drops briefly
    - Temporary motor paralysis
    - Still feel pain at the end stage of labour
    - The first epidural doesn't work; 10-15% need an adjustment




### Epidural Anesthesia: Headache

- MINOR Risk: "Post Dural Puncture Headache"
  - Dural Puncture  $1/200 \rightarrow 75\%$  will get a headache
    - Approximately 1/400 risk
  - Severe headache within 2-3 days of epidural
  - 50% will be treated with rest, lying down, fluids and simple meds
  - May need special treatments by Anesthesiologist











#### Artificial Rupture of Membranes

i.e. Breaking your water




#### Fetal Scalp Clip





Oxytocin - - - "Pitocin TM" - - - "The Drip"


## Assisted Delivery

#### Cesarean section




The surgeon reaches into the abdominal incision and lifts the baby's head as an assistant pushes down on the upper uterus





#### Cesarean Section - - - "C-Section"






Induction of Labour: Usually after 41 weeks










### Breastfeeding

- Breastfeeding Classes daily (not available during COVID-19 Pandemic)
- Lactation Consultants
- Follow-up Appointments at MSH



# Baby's First Blood Tests

- Heel prick test
- □ 1<sup>st</sup> 24 hours
  - Jaundice testing
  - Other rare genetic conditions



## Your Stay In Hospital

- 24 hours if you had a normal vaginal delivery (or the next a.m. if 24 hours ends up being at night)
- □ 48 hours if you had a C-section
- Any reasons to stay longer (i.e. feeding challenges, complications) will be reviewed by your doctors and plans will be made accordingly
- Baby needs a HEARING TEST and a CAR SEAT before leaving hospital

### Circumcision

- Personal decision
- \$375 if done at Mount Sinai Hospital (before discharge)
- □ \$220 if done in office by Dr. Bloom (within 1 month)

# COVID-19 and PREGNANCY




### FIRST AND FOREMOST

- You and your baby's care is the most important thing to us. For this reason we are taking several precautions to make sure you and your baby are safe and well supported.
- Here are a few things you will need to know...

□ ENTER through the **MURRAY STREET** entrance

ENTER through the MURRAY STREET entrance



- ENTER through the MURRAY STREET entrance
- You will be screened for symptoms of COVID-19 at this entrance and upon entering the 15<sup>th</sup> floor.
- Masks must be worn at all times in all common spaces in the hospital.

#### If I DO NOT have COVID-19 or symptoms?

- YOU may be asked to wear a mask in your room during the labour process depending on risk assessment by your health care provider
- ONE support person is permitted per day during the your stay, who is NOT symptomatic and NOT COVID-19 positive.
- The **ONE** support person must remain in the room for the entire duration and wear a mask.
- The ONE SAME support person is allowed one entry and one exit per day and will be rescreened upon entry. While the support person is in the hospital, in and out privileges are not possible (some exceptions may apply).

### What if I have COVID-19 symptoms at time of admission?

- A support person will be permitted.
- Your support person will need to be in FULL PPE (we will provide this) at all times.
- You will be asked to wear a mask at all times (as much as tolerable) and you will be swabbed for COVID-19.
- If you test positive, your support person will need to go home.
- Your baby will be tested during your stay using a nasal swab, umbilical cord blood sample and placental swab.
- □ If you are well, your baby will stay in the room with you.
- You can still breastfeed

#### ■ What if I am COVID-19 positive?

- □ Call ahead of time, if you can. (Triage: 416 586 4800 x 3210)
- Screeners will give you a mask and call triage
- If your support person lives with you, then they will not be allowed to enter.
- Once admitted, you can call a non-household member to be with you. They must wear FULL PPE. Support person will be given a tutorial on how to don/doff.

- What if I develop symptoms similar to COVID-19 while I am in labour?
  - Fever is a symptom of COVID-19
  - If you develop a fever, we usually administer IV fluids. If the fever resolves, no further action. This usually works!
  - If the fever does not resolve after 30min we need to rule out COVID-19 with a nasal/throat swab for your safety and the safety of others.
  - If you test positive, your support person will need to go home.

To date, NONE of the COVID swabs we have taken during labour (ie. for fever) have come back positive.

### Visitor Policy

- Unfortunately, during this time of uncertainty there are NO VISITORS
- □ NO children under 16 years of age will be permitted
- NO visitors to the post partum floor
- NO visitors to the ambulatory clinic

## Once I go home...

- □ The usual precautions need to be taken:
  - Hand hygiene
  - Social distancing
  - Wearing a mask
  - Visitors should be advised to remain outside, maintaining 2 or more metres away from you and baby.
- Sadly, this means grandparents too.




