PROOF OF VACCINATION REQUIRED FOR ESSENTIAL CARE PARTNERS

Reminder: As of October 22nd, 2021, essential care partners will need to provide proof of full COVID-19 vaccination (two doses) to enter UHN, including appointments at the TW FHT. Please visit the [TW FHT website](#) and [UHN](#) for policy details.

VACCINE CERTIFICATES WITH QR CODES

As of January 4, 2022, the province will only accept vaccine certificates with QR codes.

Get your enhanced vaccine certificate online through the provincial website.

You will need:

- a **green photo health (OHIP) card** (you will need numbers on both sides of the card, expired cards will be accepted)
- a **modern web browser** (the website is not compatible with Internet Explorer 11 or earlier)

Reminder: to access certain non-essential businesses and settings, you must wait 14 days after getting your final dose (when you are considered fully vaccinated).

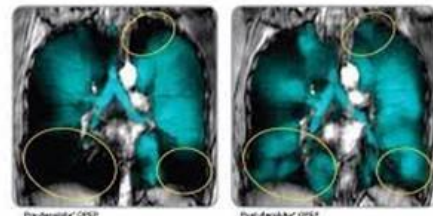
